Raising of the participation age (RPA)

- The Government is increasing the age to which all young people in England must continue in education or training, requiring them to continue until the end of the academic year in which they turn 18 from 2015.
- Raising the participation age (RPA) does not mean young people must stay in school; they will able to choose one of the three options post-16.



Raising of the participation age (RPA)

full-time education, such as school or college

an apprenticeship

part-time education or training (280hrs)
Combined with part time work (20+hrs week)
or volunteering full-time



The benefits of Post-16 qualifications

- ➤ Young people with 2 or more A-Levels earn around 14% more than those without.
- Individuals with post-16 qualifications are more likely to be employed and more likely to be re-employment following unemployment.
- Greater options for work, apprenticeships or University. Some careers require A-Levels and a degree.
- ► Graduates on average earn £150,000 more in a lifetime than non-graduates with A-Levels.


