Censorship	When an authority limits or prevents the ideas that people are allowed to express. Books, films, works of art and other forms of communication are prevented because they are considered a threat to the stability or security of the society.
List	The name of the language spoken by the people who live in the City of Ark. People who break the rules are arrested and punished by a 'gavvers' as it is believed language is the reason for the destruction of earth.
Wordsmith	The one who stores and receives all of the words humans have created. His job is to create The List – the 500 words allowed to be spoken (all the others are forbidden).
Dystopia	An imagined society that is undesirable or frightening. The opposite of Utopia where everything is perfect. The people who live there are wretched, dehumanised and fearful.
Post- apocalyptic	Relating to a time after a catastrophic event such as nuclear disaster. The event can be climatic such as a flood, tsunami or earthquake; society is destroyed and a new world emerges. The genre is characterised by a grim and desperate battle for survival. In The Wordsmith the flood occurs and a totalitarian state develops.
