
### GCSE ENGLISH LITERATURE SET TEXTS Year 10

The set texts we will study in year 10 and 11 are as follows:



1) **'A Christmas Carol' by Charles Dickens:**



You will be able to order all both texts through Parent Pay for a total price of **£14.55 (This price will also include a revision guide for Romeo and Juliet)**.

The deadline for this will be **27 September**. We will then pass the books onto your child when they arrive in school. Through ordering such high volumes, we can get a discount that might not be available if you order the books separately. Students who are in receipt of the Pupil Premium will receive copies of the text free of charge.

If you miss this payment deadline, you will need to source the books independently. We have suggested specific editions of texts for guidance, but this is not compulsory or essential. Any edition or publisher, new or second-hand, will work as long as it is the **full text** (*not abridged or a study guide*).

These texts can be purchased from local book stores including WH Smiths and Waterstones in Harrogate as well as from on-line providers such as Amazon (Amazon often have used copies in very good condition for sale too, which can represent good value as they are cheaper than new).
