
GCSE ENGLISH LITERATURE SET TEXTS Year 11

You will be able to order this text through Parent Pay for a total price of £6.40

The deadline for this will be 27 September. We will then pass the books onto your child when they arrive in school. Through ordering such high volumes, we can get a discount that might not be available if you order the books separately. Students who are in receipt of the Pupil Premium will receive a copy of the text free of charge.

If you miss this payment deadline, you will need to source the book independently. We have suggested a specific edition of the text for guidance, but this is not compulsory or essential. Any edition or publisher, new or second-hand, will work as long as it is the **full text** (not abridged or a study guide).







This text can also be purchased from local book stores including WH Smiths and Waterstones in Harrogate as well as from on-line providers such as Amazon (Amazon often have used copies in very good condition for sale too, which can represent good value as they are cheaper than new).
