
# Parent/Carer Feedback – 324 responses (49% response rate)




#### **ACTIONS linked to parental feedback:**

- Consideration of screen time communication to staff re. structuring lesson time, wellbeing afternoons/day, deliberate practice emphasised, wellbeing emphasised in tutor time, etc.
- Encourage students to have cameras on and use engagement calls to promote engagement.
- Small 'hiccups' addressed, e.g.: students not being asked to print, clearer communication and 'registration', student Teams permissions, emphasis on assessment and formative feedback with staff/in CPD, etc.
- Encourage reading for pleasure at this time/in the future through social media posts promoting reading.






 Is your learning better or worse than during the lockdown last year (March-July 2020)? More Details








'I'm able to ask the teachers for help and get a response quicker.'

I have been able to access work/learning materials when live lessons in Teams are not possible.


I am currently reading a book for enjoyment.

I need more help to access the remote learning.








I feel my teachers are striking a good balance between screen time and work based away from a...

### Actions linked to student feedback

- Tutor time tutor communications and programme to support wellbeing and engagement rolled out
- Reading social media promotion/promoted with students in lessons
- Breakout Rooms and collaboration modelled this in middle leader meetings and raise staff awareness of this facility in Teams. Provide staff CPD on this.
- Screen time/screen breaks wellbeing afternoons/day, 50m lessons, encourage staff to build-in time away from screens, tutor time wellbeing focus, etc.
