## Harrogate High School - Pupil Premium Plan Summary

Our aspiration is to raise overall outcomes for all students at Harrogate High School, with a collective drive to further accelerate the progress of disadvantaged students by creating an environment where they feel supported, rewarded and inspired.



## **Teaching**

- Develop teaching so that all learners, and particularly those who are disadvantaged benefit from improvements in responsive teaching, literacy and memory strategies.
  - Deliver well-planned, scaffolded and personalised lessons.
  - · Regular, high quality homework to deepen and embed
  - Engage in and effectively implement ongoing CPD.
  - Incorporate literacy development into lessons.
  - · Use science of learning techniques to develop retention of powerful knowledge.
- Raise the profile of disadvantaged students across school, putting them at the heart of all we do.
  - Identify who our disadvantaged students are in all lessons and know how to support their progress (evidenced on seating plans in Class Charts).
  - Include a focus on disadvantaged students in all QA and data reporting.
- Improve literacy (as part of the whole school literacy development plan).
  - Develop an understanding of subject specific vocabulary, etymology and morphology in lessons.
  - Ensure students use correct vocabulary in all written and
  - Ensure tier 2 words are mapped across the curriculum and ensure they are embedded within schemes of learning.
- Curriculum redesign to ensure we have a powerful knowledge rich curriculum which allows all students to achieve their potential.
  - Engage in ongoing CPD and QA of curricular documentation.
  - Work collaboratively to ensure that all middle leaders are scholastic in their curriculum design and implementation across their department.
  - Plan for good progress for all students, particularly targeting the disadvantaged students by teaching threshold concepts and promoting understanding of domain-centric skills to accelerate progress.



## Targeted academic support

- Provide high quality pastoral and academic support
  - Be clear on who our disadvantaged students are across the
  - Disadvantaged students are prioritised where possible for extra-curricular opportunities (sport, music, drama, dance, educational visits) and are supported to build cultural capital through enrichment and a rich curriculum offer.
  - Disadvantaged students are prioritised for CAIG, to raise aspiration and offer clear steps for progression.
  - Work in partnerships with UniConnect, York Shine and other widening participation initiatives to ensure that all students feel empowered to progress to University if they wish.
  - Deliver targeted maths and literacy support as a priority to disadvantaged students.

## Wider strategies

- Improve attendance and punctuality of disadvantaged students
  - · Work with families to support improved attendance.
  - Ensure there is a whole school focus which drives the importance of excellent attendance for academic progress and wellbeing.
  - Deliver bespoke attendance initiatives for disadvantaged students.
- Improve behaviour of disadvantaged students
  - Deliver ongoing CPD to ensure there is a consistent approach to challenging poor behaviour.
  - Work with students to ensure they have knowledge of effective tools to self-regulate to prevent escalation of behaviours, reduce lesson removals and improve the learning climate for all.
  - Launch a new student leadership team giving students power to influence the direction in which the school is moving.
