### A message from our Head of School

As I reflect on the last few months in my privileged time as acting Head, I am proud of all we have achieved at Harrogate High, particularly this term. Despite the ongoing challenges the pandemic presents, students have shown amazing courage and never fail to cheer up my day with their humour and willingness to engage in conversation. We have seen some real focus from our Year 10 and 11 students, who are approaching their studies with commitment, often attending extra after-school study sessions. Equally, our new Year 7 students have really settled into school and now it seems they are seasoned Harrogate High community members! All year groups have been working hard to achieve praise credits, with many earning the right to take part in the rewards events at the end of each half-term. (We are particularly looking forward to the staff pantomime!) I am especially proud of our newly formed Student Leadership Team and Student Voice Form Reps., who have had their first couple of meetings and an induction assembly this half-term. We are looking forward to seeing great things emerge from this student body over the coming months!



I have been impressed by the numbers re-engaging in clubs and enrichment activities. It was incredibly emotional watching Year 8 students (some of whom had never before played an instrument) perform in our first concert for around two years at the start of this month. Year 10 students did us proud in a Speaker's Trust workshop organised by Mrs Avery, Head of English, delivering presentations eloquently and showing great oracy skills, with six of them going through to a competition with the potential to represent Yorkshire. Our Year 9 boys' football team had a great win against King James in the Harrogate and Craven Cup in November, working brilliantly as a team: one of many sporting successes this term. I also had the pleasure of attending the Drama department's performance of 'All the World's a Stage' in October, which was funny, clever, and inspiring.

I should additionally acknowledge the commitment of the new Parents' Forum, who have met twice this term to hear about aspects of school life and school improvement and have taken time out of their evenings to give us valuable feedback on these areas. This will feed into our future plans, as will the parent feedback we have received on communication this term. We always welcome new members at the Parents' Forum, so please do let us know if you would like to become a member.

As the Christmas break approaches, I would like to wish all our families a peaceful and happy festive fortnight. I sincerely hope that we can all enjoy family time over this period without the stringent restrictions we endured last year. However, we are mindful of keeping all in our school community safe, so we continue to ask for your support in sending your children to school with a face covering (unless exempt) for busy, communal areas. This is particularly important with the recent discovery of the more transmissible Omicron variant of COVID-19. Please continue to use the home testing kits over the break (we have lots available for your child to collect from the school office if needed) and the night before students return to school, reporting your results in the usual way. More information will be shared separately regarding the on-site testing the government have again asked us to provide in January. With our new Head of Academy Mr Gill taking up post in January, I will resume my substantive role of Deputy Headteacher, working closely with Mr Gill and the rest of the senior leadership team to ensure that Harrogate High School goes from strength to strength. Thank you for all your support over the last two terms and have a Happy Christmas.

# Student Leaders 2021-2022



# Literacy








### **Music News**

The Music Department are incredibly happy to be back making Music after over a year away. Since the start of the new academic year, all our enrichment ensembles have been rehearsing after school every night. These include Orchestra on a Monday, Choir on a Tuesday, School of Rock on a Wednesday and Guitar Ensemble and Jazz Band on a Friday. It has been great to see so many students join us. Our instrumental tutors have seen a huge take up of lessons over the last half term and the numbers of students learning musical instruments is once again very healthy.

In November we held our first BBC Ten Pieces Orchestra workshop, which had been a resounding success prior to the pandemic. We used students that already learn a musical instrument, alongside students who have never learnt an orchestral instrument before. All students learnt to play "In the Hall of the Mountain King" by Grieg. Many will recognise this familiar piece as the theme tune for Alton Towers. Over the three hour project, students were taught how to play two or three notes on the instrument, how to read the score, count in time and perform the correct rhythms. It was fantastic to see students teaching and mentoring beginners and they all made us ever so proud. Although our new starters may not have had as many notes, they had to be on their toes counting all their rests to ensure they came in at the right places. We look forward to continuing this initiative in the next half term where we will look at "The Ride of the Valkyries." What an experience this has been for the young students to perform in such a large ensemble!

The Year 8 Concert took place at the beginning of December, and it was an absolute pleasure to see so many students involved this year. We couldn't be any prouder of these students as for some this would have been their first ever time performing on an instrument piece and even on a stage. To top it all off, this was after such a long time of not being able to make music. We heard a great mixture of pieces from "Havana", "A Million Dreams" and "Hold Back the River." Well done















to all the Year 8 students who performed a solo as well - what talent we have! What was very noticeable in this concert was the quality of the vocal work especially from the new Year 7 Boys. We hope that they will continue to develop through the Music Department and the enrichment activities that we offer.

Our main event of this term had to be our Christmas Concert. What a night of celebration this was! It was lovely to see parents and family who had come together to celebrate all the hard work that students had put in over the term. Numbers were reduced due to the covid restrictions; however the atmosphere was no different to other years. Performances included several solos and duets from some of our talented instrumentalists. We heard from ensembles such as School of Rock, Guitar group, Orchestra and our School Choir. The night was just wonderful and really got us ready and in the Christmas spirit.

We look forward to the new term with (all being well) our Year 7 Concert on Thursday 27th January and our next Orchestral Workshop.
